Kari Kivinen Observatory, European Union Intellectual Property Office

PhD Kari Kivinen, the Education Outreach Expert of EUIPO Observatory. He leads the Intellectual Property in Education project and Network to encourage and enhance creativity, innovation, entrepreneurship and responsible digital engagement among young Europeans.



Christian Guellerin

Former President of Cumulus, The Global Association of Art and Design Education and Research. Executive Director of L'École de design Nantes Atlantique

Christian Guellerin (born August 9, 1961 in France) is the Executive Director of L'École de design Nantes Atlantique since 1998. The school has become one of the French and international references in design and innovation education. It has 1,650 students in France and several branches abroad (Shangai, Pune, São Paulo, Montréal and Cotonou). The institution has grown significantly under his leadership, striving to professionalize design studies and facilitate interactions between research, business and society at large.

Christian Guellerin is Honorary president of Cumulus, the largest international association of universities and schools of design, art and media. The association includes 340 international institutions on 5 continents. Its headquarter is in Helsinki. He is president of France Design Education, an association of design schools whose purpose is to promote design and applied arts as training, creation, innovation and research activities.

Since July 2018, Christian Guellerin is the Honorary President of the Chinese French designer's association. He speaks at numerous conferences in France and abroad about design, strategy and innovation management. He is the author of numerous articles on design and pedagogy in France and abroad. In 2015 and 2016, he was one of the 50 personalities who make innovation in France according to the magazine "Usine Nouvelle". In 2016, Christian Guellerin was named Knight of the National Order of Merit.





Isabelle Vérilhac

Head of International Affairs and Innovation, Cité du design, Saint-Étienne, France BEDA President. Focal point Saint-Étienne UNESCO City of Design

Isabelle Vérilhac holds a Post-Diploma in design & research, a Doctorate in material chemical physics, and gives lectures in industrial design. She was the director of the Saint-Étienne Medical Technologies Cluster from 2003 to 2007, and has worked in design, medical research and development activities.

For 12 years she has been in charge of the relations with economic stakeholders at the Cité du design Saint-Étienne. She created and set up the materials resource center, the innovative uses and practices labs (LUPI®) and the Design Creative City Living Lab of the Cité du design. She coordinated the European Project IDeALL (Integrating Design for All in Living Labs), that combined design and user-centered Living Labs methodologies, and one of the first design program funded by the European Commission in 2012. She's in charge of the development and the management of projects for economic, territorial, societal projects. Since the beginning of 2019, Isabelle has been the International Manager and Coordinator of Saint-Étienne UNESCO City of Design and, as a member for some years of the Board of The Bureau of European Design Associations (BEDA) she was elected President in May 2021.



Chris Basias Founder, CT Lights

Chris Basias is a product designer, specializing in lighting.

In 2012 he founded his studio based in Athens, Greece. There he designs, produces and globally distributes his handcrafted lights, bespoke or custom made lighting pieces and lighting installations. He also manufactures on site all his prototypes. He has a passion for the creative process and loves getting involved in production.

The studio is supported by a talented network of manufacturers and a number of other specialist workshops who are experts in the process of producing handmade artifacts. His well considered designs are original and minimal and are characterized by simple lines and geometric forms that create abstract forms at first sight, however each design represents something.

His designs often hint at an eccentric and romantic ideal, with an element of playfulness. Some of his designs invite interaction, others highlight the nature of the materials used as well as gravity and balance. Most of his creations are sculptural and have a symmetry based on the golden ratio. Each hand-made piece has a story to tell, beauty and emotion underpinning the innovative craftsmanship.





Paivi Tahkokallio Founder and CEO of Tahkokallio Design+

Päivi Tahkokallio is the Founder and CEO of Tahkokallio Design+, a strategic design agency operating from the Arctic north in Finland.

With her track record in strategic and social design Päivi has been called the Mother of Arctic Design, a de-sign approach to support sustainable development of the Arctic, more topical than ever at the time when Europe has set an objective to become climate neutral by 2050. We know now that the Arctic is warming four times faster than the rest of the world, and design is an effective tool for transformation, be it environ-mental or social.

Päivi is the past President of BEDA, Bureau of the European Design Associations with more than 50 mem-ber organisations in close to 30 across Europe, closing her term in 2021. As President Päivi was leading the design policy work in Europe, with climate change, digitalisation and values as key topics, especially relevant in BEDA's input related to the New European Bauhaus initiative, an initiative with a stronger co-design approach than ever before in the European Commission's history.

Päivi has acted as a jury member of international design competitions, with Compasso d'Oro, DesignEuro-pa, German Design Award, Taiwan International Student Design Awards, The One Show and Turkey De-sign Awards amongst them.

Päivi is Fellow of Royal Society of Arts in the UK, FRSA, and a Committee Member of Arctic Society of Fin-land.



Luisa Bocchietto

Founder, Luisa Bocchietto Studio di Architettura e Design

Luisa Bocchietto graduated in Architecture at the Politecnico in Milano in 1985. At the same time she obtained the IED certificate - Milano for architectural interiors. Since then, with her own studio, she works both for public and private clients. She has carried out local projects focusing on development, urban renewal, residential construction, furniture, events.

She has curated exhibitions on design, as "Dcome design" (Turin, Orta - Italy, Alexandria-Egypt), "Pop Design" (Caraglio-Italy), "Compasso d'Oro Award" (Lima-Peru', Bogotà - Colombia, Brussels - Belgium), Design and Sustainability (Berlin 2019). Recently she curated "SustainabItaly" at the Wolfsonian Museum in Miami USA (2021-2022).

She is invited like a lecturer in numerous conferences in Italy and abroad (Milan, Turin, Rome, Shenzhen, Ningbo, Berlin, Mexico City, Shanghai, Nairobi, Taipei, Lille, Valencia). Jury member in many international awards (IF, Red Dot, Interzum, Europe Design Award, Szidf, Golden Pin Design Award, CIDI Iberoamericana Interior Design, TIDA -Taipei International Design Award, POC Lille WDC 2020 France, Grand Prix du Design Canada, CGA – China. Scientific Coordinator of the Design Week in Turin in 2017. Ambassador for IDD - Italian Design Day in the world for the Italian Ministry of foreign affairs in 2017 in Barcellona, 2018 in Berlin, 2019 in Montreal, 2021 in Vancouver.

She has been President of ADI, the Industrial Design Association in Italy (2008-2014). Board member of ICSID from 2013, actually WDO - World Design Organization. She became President of WDO - World Design Organization (term 2017/2019). Actually she is Senator of WDO.

Actually she is part of the Advisors Committee for Valencia World Design Capital 2022 and part of the Scientific Committee for the Candidacy of the "Italian art cooking" at the Unesco.





Robin Edman Founder, Robin Edman Innovation

Robin Edman is an independent strategic design consultant, working through his own company, Robin Edman Innovation. He is the former President of the Bureau of European Design Associations (BEDA) 2015-2017 and served as Chief Executive of SVID, the Swedish Industrial Design Foundation, between 2001 and 2017. He holds a degree in industrial design from Rhode Island School of Design, and joined AB Electrolux Global Design organisation in 1981. In parallel, he also started his own design consultancy, which he ran for the next eight years.

In 1989 Robin joined the North American operation of Electrolux, serving as Vice-President of Industrial Design for the Frigidaire Company. During this period, he started and ran the Electrolux Global Concept Design Team, to forecast future user needs. Throughout Robin's entire career he has worked towards integrating a better understanding of the importance of design from a user perspective. In 1997 Robin moved back to Stockholm as Vice President of Electrolux Global Design. He has served on the board, and been treasurer of, the International Council of Societies of Industrial Design (Icsid).



Borislava Woodford

Policy Analyst, New European Bauhaus Initiative, European Commission

Ms Borislava Woodford is a Policy Analyst at the New European Bauhaus Initiative Team run under the auspices of the President of the European Commission Mrs Ursula von der Leyen.

She has over 12 years of experience in the field of EU structural and investment funds in several different units of the EU Commission's Directorate for Regional and Urban Development, focusing on working with local and regional authorities on EU funds project management and financial instruments engineering.

Previously, Borislava had a short stint in the Cabinet of Corina Cretu, former Commissioner for regional policy and was part of the team negotiating the European Regional Development Fund Regulation for 2021-2027 in the European Council and Parliament.

That builds on her previous experience of a decade in the private sector working for PricewaterhouseCoopers and Ernst & Young Consultants in London, Paris and Brussels in their Tax and Legal Departments.

A former member of the UK's "Association of Tax Technicians', she holds a Bachelor's degree in Financial Services and Spanish from London Metropolitan University and a Masters' degree in European Integration and Development at University of VUB and Solvay Business School in Brussels.



Nathan Wajsman Observatory, European Union Intellectual Property Office

Born in Wrocław, Poland and a dual Polish/Danish national, Nathan Wajsman was educated at the University of Aarhus in Denmark and later undertook graduate studies in the USA, earning a PhD in Economics from the University of Florida and an MBA from Temple University in Philadelphia.

Dr. Wajsman was named Chief Economist of the EUIPO in May 2011. He has been with the agency since 2007, previously working in Finance and Quality Management. His team carries out economic research focusing on the role of IP in the European economy, as well as studies of infringement of IP rights and its economic consequences.

Prior to joining the Office, he spent 20 years working in the private sector. A stint as a forecasting analyst at an electric utility in Florida was followed by a career in telecommunications and finance industries in the USA and several European countries, including positions with AT&T in the USA and Belgium, Swiss Reinsurance Company in Zurich, and Claranet Benelux, a managed hosting and internet service provider in the Netherlands.

Marcus Pedersen has won several design prices; among others the DesignEurope Awards 2018.



Anna Szonyi Founder, Studio Anna Szonyi

Anna Szonyi began her career studying fine art, architecture and furniture design at Moholy-Nagy University of Art and Design in Budapest, the school of Erno Rubik (the creator of the Rubik's cube). Upon graduating from the Department of Architecture Anna moved to the United Arab Emirates (UAE) where she has spent 12 years working as an architect and design manager. Her professional experience ranges from designing bespoke furniture and small scale architectural projects, like high end villas, to managing the design of new cities and large scale master plans.

Between 2017 and 2019 she ran a design gallery and design studio in Dubai Design District: AR. Gallery + Studio.

In 2019 she shifted back her focus on furniture design, architecture and interior design projects and currently works between Dubai, Budapest and Bali.

When she designs her aim is to create beautiful, unique, functional spaces and objects by theoretical research and experimentation with systems, forms and materials. Her work is based on an idea-driven design methodology which allows the final concept to be original, aesthetically stunning, intelligently designed works that function well and that people enjoy. She designed the IDO bench, manufactured by French urban furniture maker Aubrilam, which was a finalist design in the Small and Emerging Companies category at the DesignEuropa Awards 2016.



Mar Portillo Operations Department, European Union Intellectual Property Office

Mar Portillo examined her first Registered Community Design Application in her early twenties, back in 2007. After working in other areas for a few years, she came back to the Designs area of the EUIPO in 2013 and has steadily worked as a Design Examiner ever since, which has allowed her to develop a great expertise in this area.
